Cell Tower The Town Board has adopted the Cell Tower and Amateur Radio Law. This will enable the cell tower provider to start the process of construction of the tower. Homeland Towers has informed us that they will begin construction sometime in late spring when the ground has dried out enough to move in the equipment needed.

Cold War Veterans' Exemption The Town Board has adopted the Cold War Veterans' Exemption. The exemption will be applied to the '08 county taxes and the '09 town taxes. Please contact the Assessor's office at 985-2262 ext. 323 to see if you qualify for this exemption.
